
Disk drive solutions

PowerBook Duo MiniDock

- Floppy disk drive port for a high-density (1.4 MB) floppy disk drive
- SCSI port for up to 6 additional devices, such as hard disk drives

PowerBook Duo Floppy Adapter

- Floppy disk drive port for a high-density (1.4 MB) floppy disk drive




- PowerBook Duo Dock**
- SCSI port for up to 6 additional devices, such as hard disk drives
 - High-density (1.4 MB) floppy disk drive in Duo Dock
 - Optional hard disk drive in Duo Dock

Macintosh/DOS solutions


Network adapters

If you have the appropriate Farallon connectors, a Farallon PhoneNET Card (or another network adapter) in your DOS/Windows PC, and PhoneNET Talk software, you can exchange files between your PowerBook Duo and a DOS/Windows PC.



Macintosh PC Exchange

If you have Macintosh PC Exchange software installed on your PowerBook Duo, you can use files on a DOS/Windows diskette in a high-density (1.4 MB) floppy disk drive attached to your PowerBook.



Network solutions


LocalTalk cables

You can use LocalTalk cables and System 7 file sharing to transfer information between your PowerBook Duo and other Macintosh computers on an AppleTalk network.




Farallon cables

You can use Farallon PhoneNET connectors and System 7 file sharing to transfer information between your PowerBook Duo and other computers on AppleTalk and EtherTalk networks.




Serial cable

You can use a serial cable and System 7 file sharing to exchange files with another Macintosh computer.



SCSI Disk Adapter cable

If you have a Duo MiniDock attached to your PowerBook Duo, you can use an Apple HDI-30 SCSI Disk Adapter and the appropriate SCSI cables and terminators to exchange files with a desktop Macintosh computer.



Modem solutions

Apple Remote Access

You can use Apple Remote Access software to exchange files with another Macintosh in a remote location.



Terminal emulation

You can use a terminal emulation program to connect to a host computer or an on-line information service.



Fax send/receive

You can send or receive faxes with your PowerBook and a modem with fax send/receive capability. You can print files while traveling by sending them to the fax machine in your hotel.
