



Update to AppleVision 850 Display User's Manual

Power-saving and environmental features

AppleVision monitors are equipped with energy-saving features that allow the monitors to conserve energy when the computer is not in use. The color of the power indicator light on the front of the monitor indicates the operating mode:

Mode	Power consumption watts (W)	Power indicator
Normal	<150 W	Green
Monitor sleep	<30 W	Orange
System sleep	<5 W	Orange

For instructions on adjusting the system and monitor sleep settings, and additional energy-conservation information, see “Conserving Energy” in Chapter 2 of the user’s manual. System 7.5.3 (or later) users should also see Macintosh Guide (also called Mac OS Guide).

- Energy Star compliant
