Important information about using your *College in Mind?* CD-ROM discs



Before You Use Your CD-ROM Discs

To work properly, some of the CD-ROM discs in this package require a copy of the disc's application program on your computer's hard disk or changes to some of your computer's settings. Before you insert a CD-ROM disc, follow the steps on the front and back of this card, and then refer to the table below.


1 Turn off virtual memory.


Most of the CD-ROM discs in this package require a computer feature called *virtual memory* to be turned off. Virtual memory converts a portion of your computer's hard disk space into extra random-access memory (RAM) and is often used when people need more memory to run applications. However, virtual memory is not compatible with all applications.

Before using the CD-ROM discs in this package, make sure you have virtual memory turned off.

CD-ROM disc	To get started
Correct Grammar Correct Grammar Install	Double-click the Installer icon on the CD-ROM disc. When installation is complete, double-click the Correct Grammar application icon in the Correct Grammar folder on your hard disk to use the program.
Expresso Expresso for Power PC	Double-click the installer icon in the Expresso for Power PC folder on the CD-ROM disc. When installation is complete, double-click the Expresso application icon in the Expresso folder on your hard disk to use the program. <i>Note:</i> When you first start the program, you'll be asked for a serial number. You can find the serial number on the Expresso registration card or in Expresso's electronic manual.
Infopedia Install Infopedia 2.0	Double-click the Installer icon on the CD-ROM disc. When installation is complete, double-click the Infopedia application icon in the Infopedia folder on your hard disk to use the program.


To turn virtual memory off, do this:





2 Copy only appropriate items from CD-ROM discs.

Don't copy extensions such as QuickTime. Refer to the table below for specific instructions on what to copy. Here are examples of what you might copy and what you shouldn't copy.

Important: First set your screen to 256 colors by following the instructions on the reverse side of this card. Then double-click the Installer icon on the CD-ROM disc. When installation is complete and your computer restarts, double-click the Getting Into College application icon in the Getting Into College folder on your hard disk to use the program.

Double-Click-Me to Install Jack

Double-click the Installer icon on the CD-ROM disc. When installation is complete, double-click the You Don't Know Jack application icon in the You Don't Know Jack! folder on your hard disk to use the program.

- Don't drag items such as QuickTime, Sound Manager, or System Folder Files to your hard disk. If you do, you may be replacing your computer's current versions of these files with outdated ones from the CD-ROM disc. (It's okay if some installers install these for you.)
- Never drag an entire CD-ROM disc icon to your hard disk. Copying the CD-ROM disc itself will take up most or all of the space on your hard disk.
- You don't have to copy or install a program every time you insert a CD-ROM disc, only the first time. Also, most CD-ROM discs require you to leave the disc in the drive, even after you've copied the disc's program to your hard disk and are viewing it from there.

3 Insert the CD-ROM disc you want to use.

If you don't know how to insert or eject a CD-ROM disc, see the user's manual that came with your Macintosh computer for instructions.


Note: A very few CD-ROM disc labels have artwork that can cause the disc's weight to be slightly off-center when it rotates in the drive and cause some computer models to vibrate. If you can feel or hear that the CD-ROM disc is vibrating in the computer, you don't need to do anything special; the vibration damages neither the computer nor the disc itself.

4 Refer to the table on the reverse side of this card.
